

The Anglo-Austrian Society Award for Doctoral Study
The Angela Krosik Award

The Anglo-Austrian Society proposes to make a further award for doctoral study, funded from the Angela Krosik Bequest. The award is available from the beginning of the 2021/22 academic year. Applications can be submitted from 15th May 2021. Closing date: 10 July 2021.

Eligibility

1. The award is for a full-time student who is a British or an Austrian citizen and who is registered at a university in the United Kingdom for doctoral study.
2. The award is for doctoral research on a topic related to Austria.
3. The award may be used for tuition fees or maintenance, or to assist with research costs (e.g. travel, cost of materials).

Value of the Award

4. The value of the award is £10,000 per annum.
5. The award will be paid in two equal instalments in each academic year, the first payable on 1st October and the second on 30th April.

Conditions

6. The intention is that the award will be held by the same full-time doctoral student for a maximum of three years, or until the completion of the third full year of full-time doctoral study, provided that the student's progress is deemed by The Anglo-Austrian Society to be satisfactory.
7. Renewal of the award for the second and for the third year will be conditional on written confirmation to the Society by the awardholder's supervisor before the beginning of the following year (i) that the student has made satisfactory progress with their research, and (ii) that it is anticipated that the research will be completed within the period of the award.
8. The name of the holder of the award will be published in the Society's Newsletter.
9. From the second year of registration, the awardholder of the award will be invited to give a talk on their research to members of the Anglo-Austrian Society. The awardholder will also be expected to write an account of the research being undertaken, to be published in the Society's Newsletter.

Application process

10. An application for the award should be submitted as a pdf document and sent by email to the office of The Anglo-Austrian Society - enquiries@angloaustrian.org.uk - using the subject line, Doctoral Award.
11. The closing date for applications is 10th July 2021.
12. The application must include:
 - Name of applicant and contact details
 - Details of educational background relevant to this application
 - A description of the focus and scope of the proposed doctoral study
 - Details of research already undertaken relating to the proposed doctoral study
 - The name of the university at which the applicant is (or will be) registered; the faculty and department (or equivalent)
 - The names and contact details of two referees, one of whom should, if possible, be the applicant's academic supervisor for the proposed study
 - A reference from a member of academic staff who is familiar with the applicant's recent academic work (ideally the applicant's supervisor for the proposed study)
13. The successful applicant will be contacted by 31 August 2021.

Origin of the bequest

Angela Krosik was born in 1924 in St Johann-Köppling, in south east Styria, about 30 kilometers from Graz. She settled in the UK in 1947, where she died in 2005. Assets from her estate were left to The Anglo-Austrian Society and have been used to establish this award for doctoral study, which bears her name.
